

Rules

- 1) You read and listen to the scenario
- 2) As a group decide if your section is responsible for making this scenario happen
 - If not, sit silently
 - If so, let the teacher know using your signal
 - If you're correct – receive a point
 - If you're incorrect- lose a point
- 3) After it is decided who's responsibility it is, decide if your section can “check” them
 - If so, as a group say: “check please” (same points apply)
- 4) If your group makes any kind of call out- lose a point.
- 5) For Bonus points: If you disagree with one of the judge's (Ms. Browns') rulings, write out an appeal and it will be discussed at the end of class. A well-thought out appeal could earn you a bonus point.
