

The End of the War

At Yorktown, the British were caught between the American troops and the French fleet. Unable to retreat, Cornwallis surrendered. This marked the end of fighting. However, unless a country unconditionally surrenders, a war is not over unless a treaty is written and signed. The British Parliament no longer felt that the war was in Britain's best interest, and decided to end the war.

Why did Britain decide to end the war?





The Nation Expands Treaty of Paris, 1783

Although British hopes of winning the Revolutionary War ended in 1781 with their defeat at Yorktown, nearly two years passed before the United States and Britain signed the Treaty of Paris and officially ended the war. The peace process was complicated because France, Spain and Holland and also joined the conflict, fighting with the Americans against the British. Each of these countries had their own strategic national goals for the war, which made a final peace harder to agree on. Also, although Britain's King George III did not think he could win the war anymore, he was still determined not to grant the American independence. But John Adams, John Jay and Benjamin Franklin, the three Americans sent to Britain to negotiate the peace treaty, insisted that independence for the colonies be built into the peace agreement.

The Treaty of Paris was finally ratified [passed] in September 1783 and it was a great victory for the Americans. The treaty was not only recognized the United States of America as an independent nation, but also established boundaries that extended far to the west of the original 13 colonies. The new country would be bounded by the Atlantic Ocean on the east, the Mississippi River on the west, Florida on the south and Canada and the Great Lakes to the north. Spain retained control of Florida, and the United States was permitted use of the Mississippi River.
